

INTRODUCTION

The Fatima College of nursing, Fatima Hospital, Lucknow is owned and administered by the Congregation of the Medical Sisters of St. Joseph, Little Flower Province, Lucknow.

The College offers a course in General Nursing and Midwifery recognized by the U.P. State Medical Faculty, (Letter No. GNM/ 194/95, dated 10th February 1995) and Indian Nursing Council (Ref. F. No. 20-16/97-INC).

(A) PHILOSOPHY

The College Faculty believes that nursing education is to provide systematic direction and guidance to the students during the period of professional education and training towards the fullest development of religious, moral, intellectual, emotional, physical and social qualities to be good citizen and a good nurse. We believe that the curriculum of the School of nursing should be basedon a Christian philosophy of education and of scientific principles, which will enable the students to gain knowledge and skill for rendering comprehensive nursing care in the hospital and in the community.

(B) <u>OBJECTIVES</u>

The nurses on completion of this course will be able to : -

- 1. Demonstrate awareness and skill required for the provision of total care of patients in a hospital ward as well as in a Community Health unit applying relevant knowledge from the humanities, biological and behavioral sciences.
- 2. Assess the health needs of individuals, families and communities and design an appropriate action plan to deliver nursing care.
- 3. Work with other members of the health team and community for promotion of health, prevention of illness, restoration of health and rehabilitation.
- 4. Show sensitivity and skill in human relationship and communication in her daily work.
- 5. Demonstrate true Christian spirit of service in all aspect of professional practice.

(C) <u>DURATION OF THE COURSE</u>

The diploma course in General Nursing and Midwifery shall be of three years duration. The medium of instruction is English.

(D) ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- Candidates should be between 17 and 35 years of age, by 31st December of the current year.
- 2. Candidates should be female and unmarried.
- 3. The minimum educational qualification is 10+2 passed with English subject and aggregate of minimum 40% marks and a minimum of 40% in English as a subject. Those who have appeared for Board Exams also can apply.
- 4. Physically and mentally fit to undergo the training.

Examination Guidelines

- 1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
- 2. If a candidate fail they can be promoted to next year.
- 3. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However all previous

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papers need to be cleared before appearing in the final examination.

- 4. Minimum pass marks should be 50% in each of the Theory and practical paper separately.
- 5. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
- 6. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computers to be conducted as School exam and marks to be sent to the SNRC/ Board for inclusion in the mark sheet.
- 7. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
- 8. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical)

(F) MODE OF APPLICATION

- Application form and prospectus shall be issued from the office of the College of Nursing, Fatima Hospital, Lucknow on payment of Rs. 400/-


APPLICATION SHOULD BE FILLED BY THE CANDIDATE'S OWN HAND WRITING.

1. True copies of the mark sheets and sanad (Certificates) of High School/Matriculation, and Intermediate or its equivalent examinations.



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



- 3. Two Certificates of character, one from the Principal of the college last attended by the candidate and other from the Parish priest in case of Christians.
- 4. Merit Certificate of extra curricular activities (if any).
- 5. One copy of recent passport size photograph. (Other than the pasted one on the form)
- 6. Fitness certificate from a registered Medical officer.
- 7. Adhar and Caste Certificate

(G) INTERVIEW AND SELECTION

- 1. Eligible candidates will appear for an entrance examination (Written Test) of one hour duration, containing questions from English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and General knowledge. There will be an interview after written test for those who have done the written exam satisfactorily. The date for the written test and interview will be intimated through a letter. Please enquire if you don't get the letter by
- 2. Selection and admission will be based on merits of qualifying examination, written test and personal interview.
- 3. Preference will be given to candidates from U.P. State and of Christian minority groups.
- 4. The decision of the admission committee of the institution will be final and binding. The selected candidate is required to

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deposit Rs. 10,000/- as seat confirmation fee, to the office within 5 days after the selected list has been put up on the notice board. The balance payment of the 1st year should be paid on the day of admission. The money deposited will not be refunded if the candidate does not join or discontinues the course any time after admission.

Admission Day: All those who have confirmed their setas shall take admission on 30th/31st July by paying the full fees of 1st year through D.D. only before 5.00 p.m. The seats of students who do not take admission by 31st July will be given to the waiting list candidates.

5. Selected candidate will have to undergo a complete Medical Check-up at their own expenses conducted by the institution and only those found fit will be selected for the course.

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- Mess Fees shall ONLY be acceptable and payable in CASH.
- Board Exam Fee will be paid as per instructions recieved from the State Medical faculty every year.
- Note : Rs 10,000.00 seat confirmation fee, which will be adjusted in Books & Uniform Fee.
- FEES : 2nd year and 3rd year fees shall be deposited latest by 31st of August every year. Those who want to pay in two installments may do so by the 31st August (1st Installment) and 31st December (2nd Installment) of the same year.

If any student discontinues the course after two weeks for any reason, will be liable to pay the fee of the full G.N.M course to the institution in compensation for the vacated seat.

THE COURSE STARTS USUALLY ON THE 1^{ST.} WORKING DAY OF AUGUST.

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(J) <u>RULES & REGULATIONS</u>

- 1. The students are directly under the control and direction of the Principal of the school of nursing.
- 2. All the students have to reside in the 'Nurses Hostel' provided by the hospital (Hostel rules will be given upon admission to the hostel). Ragging is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Students are expected to comply with the rules and regulations of the School, the hostel and the Hospital, subjects to change from time to time.
- 4. The student's performance is evaluated periodically, especially before promotion or appearance for State Board Examination. Students, whose conduct, attendance or performance in theory or clinical field is found not satisfactory, will not be allowed to attend the Board examination. The College authority reserves the right to promote or terminate a student, based on their performance.
- 5. The students will appear for the examinations conducted by the U.P. State Medical Faculty, at the end of each year. For the State Board Examinations, students must complete the requirements given by the council and must obtain a minimum of 50% marks in the Internal Examinations.
- 6. No certificate will be issued until all dues to the institution have been paid.
- 7. All students must wear the prescribed uniform of the College, while they are on duty and in the classrooms.
- 8. Students should be courteous and considerate to the patients, visitors, the public, authorities, co-workers and subordinates. They should impart compassionate love through their words

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and deeds and provide quality service. Students shall maintain a high standard of conduct.

- 9. Students abstaining from duty or from hostel without prior permission from the principal or her deputies will be guilty of misconduct.
- 10. Visiting the students:- Students will be allowed to meet visitors on the First Sunday of each month in the First year, Second Sunday of the month in the second year, Third Sunday of the month in 3rd year, 4th Sunday in internship. Only those visitors approved by the parents will be allowed to meet them. When you want an exception from this, please discuss with principal before you come. Taking visitors to the rooms or any other section of the hostel is considered a serious offence, and will be dealt with accordingly.
- 11. Visiting hours is from <u>10.00 A.M. to 3.00 P.M. in P.T.S. period</u> on Off days, from 1.00 P.M. to 5.00 P.M. Visitors during working day and duty hours are strictly forbidden.
- 12. Phone calls: Phone calls to students are entertained only between **2.30 P.M. to 7.30 P.M. on Sundays**. Specific days are kept for each year students, for the convenience to get phone call to all. No phone calls will be entertained during the preparatory and examination days.
- 13. Students are allowed to keep mobile phone and can use on Sunday only. If you want to contact the Principal. Mob: 9454036125 and E-mail ID of the College- fatimacon2015@gmail.com
- 14. Students in 1st year and 2nd year are allowed to have one month of holidays while students in 3rd year are allowed holidays for only 15 days. The annual leave is arranged by the school at such

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time as convenient in keeping with the requirements of the course. The leave period cannot be altered for individual students. Extra leaves taken shall be made up before board examination. Others who take long sick leave will have to either join supplementary batch or join the next session. No Special leave will be granted for functions, weddings etc.

- 15. Religious sisters are expected to make their retreat during their annual leave.
- 16. Students should have medical examination every year. If a student is found medically unfit, she will be required to leave. All medical expenses must be met by the student. Any student suffering from a serious illness requiring long rest is sent home for recuperation. In case of need, the student period may be extended to another academic year.
- 17. Students will be dismissed, at any time, for misconduct, disobedience, inefficiency or repeated serious negligence of duty.
- 18. Students are forbidden to accept gift or hospitality of any kind from patients or their attendants.
- 19. Students may not collect any money for treat, get together and even for charitable purpose without sanction of the principal.
- 20. Students will be asked to replace or compensate for loss or damage caused to equipments.
- 21. Students shall not bring any jewellery, except a pair of small ear studs for use. The institution takes no responsibility for the theft or loss of any personal articles or money of the students.
- 22. Marriage is not allowed during the student period.
